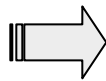


## Read Your Own Story

**Ask yourself the following questions:**

● In the ***beginning of the story***, did I tell the reader about the **setting**? Did I tell the reader *where* and *when* the story takes place?



Did I also show the reader what the **main problem** of the story was going to be? Am I sure a reader will understand it?

● In the ***middle of the story***, did some of my **characters** try to solve the **main problem**? What happened when they tried?

● How would I describe the ***end of my story***? (*circle one*)

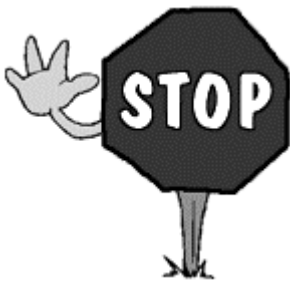
- ✓ Take your story home.
